A Meeting of the Village Council was held in J. A. Fount's office on February 6th 1922 and the following was transacted;

The Assessment Roll for the year 1922 was Thoroughly discussed by the Board and Revised and it was moved by C. F. Weisgerber seconded by Geo. Buehring that this assessment Roll be adopted as Revised; and the Notices be sent out at once and the Tax Notices following in due course = carried

Moved by Geo. Buehring seconded by C. F. Weisgerber the Secretary-treas be authorized to pay Karl Seizler One Dollar (\$1.00) as Rental for Nuisance Ground for Year 1922 as per Agreement carried

### BY LAW.

After due Consideration by all Members of the Council of Sec. 33A and Sec. 39-Chapter 5 first session 1913 of the Village Act it was Moved by C. F. Weisgerber and seconded by G. W. Buehring that No Buildings or any enclosure of any Nature whatsoever could be built in the hereafter within the limits of the Village of Beiseker or removed within the said limits without first having a written Permitt from the Council of said Village; carried

### BY-LAW.

Complying with Sec 83A Chapter 5-first session 1913 all persons carrying on a trade, business or profession including lawyers, Grain buyers, Elevators, Oil Companies, Doctors, Store Clerks, Bank Clerks, Book Keepers, Boarding house keepers or any other any person residing within the Village ~~for~~ for a Period of 30 days who does not otherwise Pay a Tax

The Minimum amount to be \$1.50
