

Annual Meeting

Beiseker, Alberta
February 13, 1950

The annual meeting of the rate payers of the Village of Beiseker was held in the meeting room of the Beiseker & District Memorial Hall on Monday, February 13th, 1950 commencing at 8:00 P.M.

Twenty-four persons were in attendance namely Messrs Henry Reipnayde Sr., T. A. Haunt, Matt Schmitz, L. F. Holubec, Alvin Reipnayde, John Klein, Frank Wright, W. J. Hawrie, Alex Goodman, Frank Schmitz, Elias P. Schmitz, Wm Didy, Leo Schmitz, Adam Veller, John Scheffelmaier, J. H. Schmitz, Carl H. Schmitz, Otto Setz, New Wright, H. H. Schmitz, Mike Baummaier, Peter Schmidt, Carl Holubec, and Peter Denes.

Carl Holubec was nominated chairman by Matt Schmitz. His Schmitz closed nominations. Carried.

Peter Denes was nominated Secretary by T. A. Haunt. Alvin Reipnayde closed nominations. Carried.

Moved by T. A. Haunt that the minutes read by the Secretary from the last annual meeting be adopted as read. Seconded by L. F. Holubec. Carried.

The chairman Carl Holubec then called upon the various officials of the Village to give their reports concerning their activities and work during the past year 1949.

The Mayor's Report:

Mayor H. H. Schmitz reported to the meeting that the Council during the past year held their meetings on the second Monday of each month, as well as special meetings on important matters. Whenever it was impossible to hold a meeting on their meeting nights, a meeting would be held as close to that date as possible. In closing Mayor H. H. Schmitz stated that the Councillors worked well together in the interests of the community and the Village.

The Secretary-Treasurer's Report:

The Secretary-Treasurer read the Financial Statement for the Village of Beiseker. He explained each item as fully as possible and answered questions concerning the figures as appearing on the statement. It was moved by New Wright and seconded by Alex Goodman that the Financial Statement be adopted as read. Carried. In closing the Secy-Treasurer explained the necessity or the requirement of the present high mill rate of 67 mills consisting of 41 mills for school purposes and 26 mills for municipal requirements. He also stated that 17 dog licenses had been issued and one dray license.

The Auditors Report:

The Auditor, Mr Katterhagen was unable to attend, but the rate payers were satisfied that the Secy Treasurer Peter Denes had explained the Auditors Financial Statement as fully as possible.

The Commissioner of Roads and Building Report:

Mr. Matt Schmalz explained to the ratepayers the necessity of obtaining Building Permits before building within the Village especially in the case of anticipation of installing cesspools as these had to be approved by government inspectors. He told the ratepayers that during the past year 12 permits had been issued valued at approximately \$30,000.00. He also hoped that in the near future, the Village of Beiseker would consider the installation of water & sewage system within the Village.

Sanitary Inspector and Child Welfare Inspector's Report:

As Mr. C. D. Rohrke held both positions, he first reported as Sanitary Inspector. He stated that although the Village in general was fairly clean, many improvements could be made. He hoped that the ratepayers and residents would even make greater efforts in keeping our Village neat and clean - especially in our alleys by cutting weeds and keeping garbage in covered containers. As Child Welfare Inspector, Mr. C. D. Rohrke reported that our children were well looked after in nearly all cases & well behaved in most incidents.

Old Business:

No old business was discussed out of the minutes read.

New Business:

Mayor H. H. Schmalz suggested to the ratepayers that each ratepayer install new or better garbage containers, especially with lids, and if possible on wooden stands. He hoped that this would greatly reduce unclean and unsightly alleys, as well as protect the health of the community. Covered garbage cans would also discourage stray dogs and cats from entering our Village and remaining within the Village.

Matt Schmalz dealt further with the plan of installing a water & sewage system within the Village. He stated that our Village was steadily growing and sooner or later this would actually become a necessity. He also suggested to the new Council which would be in office this year to study the possibility of imposing a business tax in addition to the property tax.

Carl H. Schmalz brought to the attention of the Council which was in attendance, that a street light was a necessity on the corner of First Ave and Eighth Street, as the heavy traffic along First Ave warranted a street light, especially in the fall of the year.

The ratepayers were not satisfied with the setting up and the printing of the Financial Statements which had been mailed to the ratepayers. They argued that the statement did not give enough information. It was therefore moved by Alex Goodman and seconded by Henry Diefnyder that if the cost of having the Auditors Financial Statements "photographed" was not too great, that this should be done in the future. The Secy-Treasurer was advised to find out the cost of this work.

Mr J. H Schmalz, as school trustee invited the rate-payers to attend the school meeting which was to be held the following Saturday in the school house. He explained to the persons attending, that the costs of operating the schools for the coming year was even going to be higher than last year.

Moved by D. A. Hunt and seconded by Matt Schmalz that the meeting do now adjourn. Time 10:00 P.M.
