THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEISFKER HELD APRIL 9, 1973 IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS.

MINUTES:

As the minutes of the previous meeting were circulated Councillor moved their adoption. CARRIED.

On a motion by Councillor Schmaltz it was moved that from this day on, no seconder be used on simple motions.

BUSINESS FROM MINUTES:

Councillor Hagel commented that at a previous meeting a discussion was held about the Town Foreman and these comments were not included in the minutes and wished the following comments to be included:

"Councillor Hagel noted that he had noticed that Mr. O. Tetz on numerous occasions as being with Village equipment when he was apparently under the influence of liquor, he felt that we had an obligation to the public for the safety as as well as to the taxpayer for their equipment and some action should be taken to prevent these accidents from happening. After some discussion Mayor Schmaltz suggested that the Council meet with Mr. Tetz regarding the problem at 4 P.M. the following day." This was discussed by Council and a meeting was called again for Thursday evening April 11 at 7;30 P.M.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT:

Councillor Schmaltz discussed with the Council the wiring at the lift station and the Secretary than read a letter received from Mr. Eitzen - Electrician and he quoted \$445.00 without the outside box. Mayor Schmaltz than told Council that he had answered Mr. Eitzen's letter previous to the meeting and informing Mr. Eitzen that his quotation was excepted, Councillor Schmaltz than moved that the Mayor's action be excepted by Council and that he had also informed Mr. Eitzen include the steel box needed on the outside of the building.

Mayor Schmaltz informed Council that the Village had no stop signs on hand and that some were ordered. And also stated that he had discussed the road from 1st Ave to the Railway Crossing with the R.C.M.P. and it was suggested that perhaps this road should be removed and the turnoff be at the end of 1st Avenue with a Stop sign. If this road was removed Calgary Power Limited would have to move a pole, Mayor Schmaltz instructed by Council to investigate the possibility of this road being removed and discuss the possibility of moving the pole with Calgary Power Ltd. The possibility of having lights at the Railway crossing was discussed by Council. Councillor Schmaltz to discuss this the R,C.M.P. and possibly they could contact the Municipal District of Rockyview.

Mayor Schmaltz welcomed the visitors Mr. McCune and Mr. Leo Schmaltz to the meeting and the Secretary than read a letter that was received by the Village from the Big Country Tourist Association stating that Beiseker had been included in their area and a statement for fees were included for \$100.00 This was discussed at some length by Council and guests and Councillor Hagel moved that the Village accept the statement from Big Country Tourist Assoc. of \$100.00 for 1973. Carried.

The Chamber of Commerce of Beiseker would like to have permission of the Village to use the part of the village garage building to set up a Bicycle Museum for Mr. Lister's odd bicycles. Mayor Schmaltz suggested that perhaps an agreement should be drawn up to cover this action. This was discussed at some length re insurance etc. Councillor Hagel than made a motion that the Chamber of Commerce be allowed to use this building for the balance of 1973. CARRIED. Mayor Schmaltz was not in agreement with the motion.

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The Chamber representatives would clean up the building and paint the interior and there should be no cost to the Village.

Mr. Earl Whittaker, Chairman of the Recreation Board was welcomed to the meeting by Mayor Schmaltz, Mr. Whittaker said he would like to inform Council that the Students of the Beiseker High School of which he is Prinicipal are planning a Slave Day for May 11 whereas they would hire themselves out for that day from 9 o'clock in the morning until 3;30 in the after noon for the price of \$5.00 per students, Mr. Whittaker suggested that perhaps the Village would be interested in hiring some of these students for Village clean-up.

Mr. Whittaker also stated that Recreation board must have an agreement with the Arena Society after the completion of the building, and also stated that two members of the Recreation board have been appointed by the Recreation Board to serve on the Arena Management Board, Councillor Schmaltz moved that Council ratifies the appointment of these two members. That they would also like a letter from the Village Planning for there approval of building the Arena in Friendship Park on the S.E. corner of Block "V" Plan #1816GG this was moved by Councillor Hagel. CARRIED.

Mr. Whittaker also stated that a letter be sent from the Village to the Agricultural Society that they grant tenure to the Society for their use of the building when completed. Moved by Councillor Schmaltz. CARRIED.

Councillor Hagel suggested that perhaps a vapor lite should be installed at Friendship Park near the concession buildings, he had inquired at Calgary Power and the cost would \$3.75 per month. Councillor Hagel explained that there is a lot of vandalism at the park and perhaps if the area was lighted this would improve. This was discussed by Counci: and decided that a study should be made by the Recreation Board re roads and where some trees should be planted in the Park.

The Annual meeting was discussed and Mr. J.M.Service had asked at the meeting if another light could be installed at the intersection of Highway 9 and service road into the Village. It was decided by Council that a letter be sent by the Village to Mr. McFetridge, of the Department of Highways if this intersection could be lighted.

The Feed mill property was discussed by Council and was decided for Councillor Schmaltz to contact Mr. John Koot of Linden and perhaps he would know of the persons involved in property.

The McInnes property was also discussed and Mayor Schmaltz stated that he had been in contact with Mr. McInnes and they were prepared to sign the property back to the Village in lieu of taxes.

Mr. Milton Martin had asked at the Annual meeting that perhaps some work should be done in the alley behind his home, Council to study this area to see what can be cone. Councillor Hagel also suggest that perhaps a study behind the I.G.A. store to the hall could have some work done on it at the same time, because this to seems to have some drainage problems.

Mayor Schmaltz than read a letter that was received by Regional Project # 1 from the Water Resources that they would do a study of the water situation in this area in the near future.

A Building permit was received from Gulf Oil for the building of an office and storage shed on Block F Plan # 4126 JK Moved by Councillor Schmaltz to pass this permit. CARRIED.

That Mr. John Morash now the owner of Lot 7, Block 4, Plan # 1192 FR.

That Raymond and Dorothey Schleppe now the owners of lots 14, 15, 16, Block 1, Plan # 4011X.

BUILDING PERMIT:

FORESTAND PORTON

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Mayor Schmaltz stated that an agreement had been signed by the Village of Beiseker and Mr. Don Weldon of Acme that was prepared by Mr. C. Gerwing, Village lawyer to cover Mr. Weldon as the Village dog-catcher. A cheque of \$\\$1.00\to be sent to Mr. Weldon as agreed in the agreement.

A letter that was received from Mr. Pillidge, Senior Health Inspector re the Village dump grounds and in the letter suggested that perhaps the Village could come to sme agreement with the Municipal District of Rockyview to use there Municipal dump at Irricana. He also stated that the new rules and regulations re dump grounds are going to be enforced and some decisions would have to made by Council.

The Budget from the Beiseker Regional Recreation Board for the year 1973 was read to Council and was decided to table budget for the time being until such time as the Village budget meeting was held.

Councillor Schmaltz informed Council that Mr. Theissen had contacted him if there was a possible chance for him to be connected to the Village services. This was discussed and decided that some levels would have to be taken and if this was done the total cost of the connections would be Mr. Theissen's, as he lives just outside of the Village limits
