MINUTES:

As the minutes of the previous meeting were circulated, Councillor Schmaltz moved that the minutes be adopted.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT:

The financial statement for the month of January was read by the Secretary and adopted as correct by Councillor Schmaltz subject to year end audit.

BUSINESS FROM MINUTES:

The Secretary reported to Council that she had contacted other Towns and Villages re dogs and informed Council that she had learned from Airdrie of a Mr. John Grant at Didsbury was the dog catcher for there town and was very successful to this date. Secretary instructed to contact Mr. Grant about looking after the Village of Beiseker.

A letter that was sent to A.G.T. by the Mayor re obsolete telephones was read to Council and also there reply that to date the lines were still being used and could be removed late in 1974 or early 1975.

A letter that was sent to A.G.T. re portable office and there reply was also read to the Council and stating that portable building would be used until further expansion warranted bigger facilities. The building permit for this development was discussed and some of the conditions that could placed on the approval of the permit.

The Peddler's licenses were discussed by Council and the Secretary reported what she had learned from other offices and she was instructed to write to the A.U.M.A. for copies of such a By-Law.

BUILDING BY-LAW # 74-1 The new building By-Law was again discussed by the Council at some length, The By-Law was given first and second reading in May 1973 and it was than moved by Councillor Schmaltz to give the new By-Law a third and final reading, seconded by Councillor Service. The By-Law was given the number 74-1 and finally passed.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

The snow removal was discussed by Council and Mayor Schmaltz instructed to obtain prices on same.

Mayor Schmaltz welcomed Mr. Vickerman, Village Engineer of Reid Crowthers and Partners of Calgary to the meeting. Mr. Vickerman than proceeded to explain to Council that he had contacted only one firm in regards to the sidewalks and curbs project for main street and there quote was \$110,000.00 which was of course way out of line of the proposed project. This was discussed at some length and was decided by Council that perhaps the work could be done locally. With local help, trucks and machinery and could than stay within the grant that was available from the government. Mayor Schmaltz instructed to contact Mr. Whittaker if he would be interested in taking charge of this project. And also contact Five Star Gravel on supplying the cement. Mr. Vickerman could work with Mr. Whittaker on what was to be done.

The Department of Environment letter to the Village was read to Council and this was discussed by Council and Mr. Vickerman and it was moved by Councillor Service to write Mr. Vickerman and give him authority to plan the work to be done on the lagoon.
CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

The water and Sewer extensions along 8th Street to 4th Avenue were discussed also with the engineer and a letter to be sent to Mr. Vickerman giving authority to proceed with plans for this extension and also to include plans to extend the service to the Industrial Area. Mr. Vickerman than excused himself from the meeting.
