Delegatior	; Mr. Matt. Schmaltz, representing the Com. Betterment Com. of the Beiseker Lions Club presented a letter he had received from McCutcheon Ltd. surveyors, regarding the land to be turned over to the Village by the United Grain Growers Ltd. and the Alberta Wheat Pool, for a childrens play ground. McCutcheons stated that because of the nature of the lands under transfer, a registered subdivision plan would be very complicated to complete.It was suggested instead, that a replotting scheme would be much simpled to finalize and would serve the purpose just as well. After some discussion the Cpuncil decided to accept the

Collier, village solicitor, answering a letter from the village, and stating that Mr, Nowers would be given full information on both sides of the Disposal Site appropriation question. 4.
