Hinutes: :

The minutes of a regular meeting of the Council held on Monday, March 16th, 1959 were read and adopted on amotion by Councillor Lavoie.

The Mayor and the Sec-Treas, then signed these cirutes.

Cash statement: The Sec-Treas read the cash statement for the month ending March 3Ist. Councillor Lavoie moved that the statement be accepted subject to the year and audit. CARRIED

The Nayor and the Sec-Treas then signed this statement.

From minutes:

The Hayor reported that the approach to the sewer disposal site from Mo. 9 highway had been completed, and that maintenance work could now be done at the site without crossing private property to do so.

Council discussed the matter of the Trailer Park. It was sta ted that the park counld use more trailer spaces as there were trailers waiting to come in when room was available. Councillor Lavoic moved that six additional spaces be developed. CARRIED

The matter of the water meters was brought up for discussion Information obtained from Meptune Meters of Calgary indicated that the meters would cost about \$1970:00 and that they could probably be installed by Town Foreman Jack Krenzler with some assistance. Council agreed to order the meters at o nce and to begin installation as soon as possible.

Council also agreed to follow the rates used by Carbon for

metered water begining June Ist, 1959. These rates are as follows;

First 2500 gals. or less \$35 50 per month Minimum charge

3:50 per month Next I7,500 (als. I:20 per month per Mhousand

Next IO,000 gals. I:00 per month per thousand It was also agreed to charge IO:00 per commercial meter and 5:00 per domestic meter as a Consumers Carantee.

Mayor Schmaltz read a letter from the Dept. of Highways asking Council to mark on an enclosed map of the Village streets in the Village which Council would want to have paved under a proposed Government assistance program. After some discussion, Council agreed on the streets in question and instructed the SecTreas to fill in the information as requested

 $brack ext{Py-Law I37}$ The agreement between the Village and Calgary Power Ltd. which was up for renewal for a further period of IO years was presented to Council by Mayor Schmaltz, together with a copy of the By-Law necessary to ratify the agreement. Council studied the agreement and discussed some minor points.

> The Dy-Law was presented and Councillor Lavoie moved it be given first reading.

The Sec-Treas informed the Council that the By-Law would be numbered I37 if finally passed.

The Sec-Treas. was instucted to forward a copy of the Dy-La and acopy of the agreement to Calgary Power Itd. for submission to the Board of Public Utility Commissioners in Edmonton.
