Mayor Richter called the meeting to order at 7:25 P.M.

DELEGATIONS:

(a) Gail Sokolan Calgary Regional Planning Commission

#### (i) Area Structure Plan

The changes to the municipal reserve portion of the area structure plan were reviewed. This municipal reserve was previously given to one landowner. Since there are two landowners involved this has now been changed- 10% of each property has been taken in reserve.

Mrs. Sokolan also reviewed the changes in the access road on Mr. Schmaltz's property and the letters received from the circulation of the area structure plan.

BYLAW 81-13

Councillor Fegan moved that second reading be given to Bylaw 81-13 being a Bylaw of the Village of Beiseker to provide for an area structure plan for the southern end of the Village contained in Block 2 Plan 7610019 and the southern portion of Certificate of Title No. 109X40.

Mrs. Sokolan suggested that the General Municipal Plan be re-written as the present plan is incomplete. This General Municipal Plan should contain every aspect of planning and policy that Council and the community at large would like to see happen in a five year period.

Mrs. Sokolan also suggested that this plan should reflect the wishes of the citizens and therefore the public should be involved in the re-write of the General Municipal Plan through meetings and public input.

# (iii) Rural Industrial Land Use

There was much discussion concerning the Village of Beiseker position.

Mayor Richter moved that Council re-affirm their position opposing rural industrial land use but that the following compromise be considered:

That rural industrialization be allowed in the metropolitan part of the Calgary region (as defined in the 1980 Regional Plan) under the following conditions:

- (a) that parks be located where regional utility systems exist.
- (b) when these parks are located near urban municipalities, cost sharing agreements for social and recreational services should be negotiated between the rural and urban municipalities.

Carried.

At the next C.R.P.C. meeting on December 9, 1981 any municipality can give suggestions for changes to the rural industrial land use policy. These suggestions must be submitted prior to December 9, 1981 so they can be circulated.

Beiseker Council will meet, on December 3, 1981, with the Council members of the surrounding municipalities to discuss Beiseker's position and review any other comments or suggestions from other municipalities.
