Various items concerning the arena insurance were discussed.

(a) Review of Public Works Items

1. Drainage Ditches

Now that the drainage ditches are dry all the debris should be removed

The grades should be adjusted where necessary

All grass should be mowed and any culvert ends that are damaged should be repaired

These items should be scheduled on a "per block" basis in order to complete the job thoroughly

The high priority area remains between 8th and 9th street between 2nd and 3rd avenues

2. Streets

All those streets that do not have recent oil or a hard surface must be graded and swaled so that drainage is improved.

(a) Review of Public Works Items (Continued)

- 3. All alleys should be graded and areas needing gravel should be noted
- 4. A blade attachment. for behind the Public Works tractor for lane maintenance should be included in the 1983 capital budget
- 5. The road south of Beacon Heights should be sloped properly to insure adequate drainage.
- 6. The reserve strip between lots 27 & 28, Block 4 Plan 7810947 Beacon Heights Phase I has still not been landscaped.
- 7. Rbund-up weed spray can be used along 4th avenue because the slope does not allow for grading and mowing.
- 8. Gravel placed on lot 12, block 4 Plan 7810947 Beacon Heights Phase I should be levelled or removed to another location
- 9. The lane between 8th and 9th street between 1st and 2nd avenue

Councillor Carter reported that a very large amount of gravel would be required to assist the drainage of the laneway between 1st and 2nd avenue. If we attempt to do this the garages would be much lower than the sidewalks on 1st & 2nd Avenue.

Councillor Carter moved that sufficient gravel be placed on the lane between 8th and 9th street between 1st and 2nd avenue to stop the flow of surface water from 9th street to 8th street. The budget does not allow the placing of sufficient gravel to allow the normal drainage flow along the lane from 2nd avenue to 1st avenue.
