PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS

(a) Road Chipping and Oiling

Road chipping and oiling will now take place the week of June 17th weather permitting.

(b) Main Street Patch Repair

(c) Lampson Avenue Culvert

120 feet of 16" culvert is required to be placed on Lampson Avenue at the corner of the Lift Station. It was suggested that the Village of Acme be approached to see if they have any surplus culvert available.

(d) Reservoir Window

Public works will receive estimates on regular shatter proof windows to replace the broken window at the reservoir.
