New owners of Lot 1 & 2 Block 2 Plan 4011X 719 - 1st. Ave.

Mrs. Heinzig requested that Land Use Bylaw 79-15 be amended to include Single Family Dwellings and Accessory Buildings in the Central Business Expansion District. They have purchased the above mentioned property and wish to renovate the house and build a new garage. By-law 79-15 would not allow any up-grading on existing residential properties in this district.

The Administrator sited other instances where owners of property in this district have been upset and discouraged when they cannot do improvements on homes or garages because of restrictions in the bylaw. There is ample commercial property available at this time to handle moderate growth. If Single Family Dwellings and Accessory buildings were to be included in the district it would be at the owners discretion if they wished to sell their property for commercial use.

Mayor Fegan moved that Bylaw 79-15 be reviewed and that Single Family Dwelling and Accessory Building be included in Central Business Expansion district. Notice of the intent will be given to the Municipal Planning Commission and necessary advertising will be placed in newspapers with a public hearing date to be set for an appropriate time. CARRIED
