Mayor Fegan acting as Chairperson opened the meeting at 7:00 P.M. stating that the Public Hearing was being held pursuant to Section 139 of the Planning Act as amended.

PUBLIC HEARING PORTION

The Chairperson declared the Public Hearing Portion of the meeting open.

The Secretary went on to say that the nature of the proposed Bylaw amendment is to rezone property located at 410 - Sixth Street, legal description Lot 5 excepting thereout the southeasterly 20' and the northwesterly 50' of Block 1 Plan 2791HK. The rezone would redesignate this property from single family to central business.

Notice of the Hearing was given in writing to the owner of the property, to all adjacent land owners and to a staff member of the Regional Planning Commission.

Notice of the Hearing was also published in two issues of the Rocky View Five Village Weekly namely the June 12 and June 19 issues.

The Chairperson went on to state the rules of conduct to be followed for presentations at the hearing.

PRESENTATIONS

1. Jeff Cameron

Jeff Cameron mentioned that the proposed land rezoning should not harm or lower the value of adjacent properties, in fact he mentioned that it should increase it as the building that he proposes to use has been neglected in the past and he has put in a lot of time and effort in upgrading the facility. He also mentioned that he is willing to put up a fence on the east side of his property to act as a buffer between that property and the property to the east.

2. Development Officer

The Development Officer mentioned that spot zoning is not desirable however this application, namely being a professional service application, would not produce any noise, extra vehicular traffic or odors and therefore may be somewhat different than a regular retail outlet, and therefore may be desirable.

3. Calgary Regional Planning Commission

As a staff member could not be present a letter was sent from the staff member to be read at the Public Hearing, this letter is attached and forms a part of these minutes.

Council asked Jeff Cameron if he would be willing to make an agreement that would stipulate that he is only to sell his business, if he does so in the future, to another professional type business.

Jeff Cameron mentioned that he has no problem in having his lawyer draw up such an agreement and signing it.

The Public Hearing Portion of the meeting was closed at 7:15 P.M.

After lengthy discussion Council decided to go ahead with the rezoning provided that the applicant erect a fence on the east side of his property and that the applicant submit an agreement resticting the selling of the business, if indeed it does sell some time in the future, to another professional type business.

Councillor Stewart moved second reading of Bylaw 90-7 being a Bylaw of the Village of Beiseker to amend Land Use Bylaw 79-15. Carried.

Deputy Mayor Klappe moved third reading of Bylaw 90-7 being a Bylaw of the Village of Beiseker to amend Land Use Bylaw 79-15. Carried.

(a) Public Works Items

1. Cost of Friendship Park Gate

The proposed cost of the Friendship Park Gate was \$1,800. After lengthy discussion it was determined that this is too much for this year and that a cost estimate for putting in the supporting posts for 1990 would be obtained with the intention of putting up the remainder of the sign in 1991.

It was also mentioned that a letter will be sent to the Lions Club explaining Council's position and again requesting them to remove the old sign.

2. Road Work

Foreman Hnybida left a message that he would be starting road work on Tuesday, which would include grading, gravelling and oiling. Signs are to be put up before oiling starts and a letter will be sent out to all residents informing them that oiling is about to begin.

3. Fire Hydrant Maintenance

It was mentioned that Stan Miles will be out on July 3 and 4, 1990 to repair all fire hydrants in the Village, anyone willing to accompany him to find out more on repair and operation of fire hydrants is welcome to go along.

The Fire Chief went on to explain a program that she would like to run during Fire Prevention Week which is October 7, to 13, 1990. The Program entails giving everybody who has a workable and well maintained smoke alarm or fire alarm in their home, a \$5.00 rebate on their next water bill. She mentioned that because of time constraints, she would like to start inspections one week before fire prevention week.

Council briefly discussed the possibility of this program and the following motion was then made:

Councillor Beagle moved that the Fire Department go ahead with their Fire Prevention Program in which the Fire Chief will inspect household smoke alarms and smoke detectors and hand out coupons that would entitle the holder to \$5.00 off their next water bill.
