# ADOPTION OF MINUTES

# PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS

#### (a) Tennis Courts

Res. #91-188

Councillor Schmaltz moved that the Public Works Foreman go ahead with the construction of a practice board for the tennis courts and that 2 x 12's be inserted in the ground around the perimeter of the fence and that the fence be attached to these 2 x 12's. Carried.

#### (b) Friendship Park Gate

#### (c) Public Works Supervision

#### (d) G.M.C.

#### (e) Resident Alley

Councillor Klappe moved that the owner of the duplex be sent a letter stating that their tennants are not to dig trenches in the alley for any reason whatsoever. Carried.

Adam Velker will be called letting him know that a letter will be sent to the duplex owner and also stating that Public Works will repair the alley with the land leveller.



### PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS

#### (f) Inventory

Deputy Mayor Beagle thanked both Councillor Klappe and Foreman Hnybida for the great comprehensive inventory list they established. This list will be put on the word processor so that it can be updated at any time.

#### (q) Water Upgrade

Another Act Pak has been installed but it was not mounted in its permanent position. This Act Pak also did not have a meter to measure the flow of chlorine into the system. The Administrator will call Lee Maher Engineering regarding this problem.

#### (h) Campground

The campground will be opened on April 15, 1991. Foreman Hnybida mentioned that at the end of the season he will install two posts with a chain across to keep people out of the campground in the off season.

#### (i) Transfer Station

Foreman Hnybida expressed the need to put a fence up at the transfer station sometime this summer.

#### (j) Sewerline Dig Up

On April 18 the sewerline at the Mark Christie house will be dug up and repaired.

#### (k) Oil Tank

The oil tank is nearly complete with just some welding to be done on the tank.

Currently the electrician is making repairs at the lift station as the pump does not want to run on automatic.

- 4. The service bay is no longer in use and therefore does not serve its original intended purpose
- 5. Due to the G.S.T. he was required to drop his motel rates to keep customers.
