Garbage Truck	The need for a garbage truck was discussed by the Public Works Foreman.
96-107	Councillor Fegan moved to look at purchasing a vehicle for hauling garbage at a cost of between \$6,000.00 and \$8,000.00, to have the Village front end the total cost from reserves out of the 1996 budget and to charge back half the cost in the 1997 budget.
