CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Mayor Taylor.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Councillor Schmaltz moved to adopt the Agenda as presented.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES

Councillor Fegan moved to adopt the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Council of CARRIED UNAN. the Village of Beiseker, held October 15, 1996.

PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS

Propane Prices

Propane Prices for Bow Valley Co-op, Superior Propane and Canwest Propane were presented. Council decided to stay with Canwest for now but to monitor the prices for Bow Valley Co-op.

Storm Sewer

The storm sewer is plugged on 6th Street by 4th Ave. near the Apartments. Public Works to use railway ties to keep the area clear from leaves and debris.

Fencing at Apartments

Public Works was instructed to clear out the drainage area in front of the apartments and put cabling in front so that vehicles will not park on the boulevard area. This work to be done if possible before winter.

Drainage Problem

5th Street & 3rd Ave It was decided to hold off on doing any work on this drainage problem until the Spring when we decide what we will be doing with that roadway.

9th St. & 2nd Ave

Public Works was instructed to talk to Ruby Straub with regard to recommendation from the engineers on the ditch in front of her property.

Water Well #7

Public Works advised Council that well #7 was drilled in 1984 with a 20 year life expectancy which leaves us with only eight years and with the increased demand from Bovar this could be less than an eight year expectancy.

Administration was asked to get the geological studies from Sulpher Works Inc. and for Public Works to start future planning for drilling of a new well.

Yield Signs

The yield signs were installed on 7th Street at 2nd and 3rd Avenues, October 21.

Campground

The campground will be shut down on October 29.

Dust Control

Dust control on the Beacon Heights Road and Fifth Avenue was discussed. This item will be brought up again in the Spring to be discussed as a possible substitute for pavement on fifth avenue.

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Compost Pile

Public Works Foreman talked to Council about the possibility of putting a compost pile at the transfer station. We could get a second hand rototiller to put behind the massey for turning over the soil. Council felt this was a good idea and that Public Works should pursue this avenue.

Burn pit at Shop or transfer site

The possibility of having a burn pit at the transfer site or shop was discussed. Council would like to have it set up at the shop and asked Public Works to coordinate this with the Fire Department as far as permits and burning is concerned.

Gas Water Pump at Reservoir #1

We have a gas water pump at reservoir # 1 that is not being used and is not connected. Public Works would like to pull it and sell it. Council agreed with this decision and we will be sending it possibly to Acme Auction.

Garbage Truck Update 96-115 Councillor Bell moved to purchase the garbage truck from the City of Drumheller for the price of \$6,000.00.

Sewer Flusher 96-116

Deputy Mayor Beagle moved to purchase the sewer flusher from Cochrane for \$7,500.00 which will be purchased over a two year term beginning with the 1997 budget.

Administration asked to put in the Village Informer that as of November 1 residents wanting to use the transfer station would need to call the Village Office to make an appointment with Public Works to have this service.

Bensons Industries

A letter from Tom Clark, engineer for Bensons Industries, was discussed with regard to several items such as 9th Street subdivision fill; drainage issues; water distribution system monitoring at Well #7 and sewage lagoon licence renewal.
