CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called at 7:00 P.M. by Deputy Mayor Beagle.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Councillor Fegan moved to adopt the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Council of the Village of Beiseker, held October 28, 1996 and the Organizational minutes held October 28, 1996.

Deputy Mayor Beagle moved to adopt the Financial Statement for October as presented.

PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS

Snow Removal

Snow removal on the roads and sidewalks was discussed.

96-122

Councillor Bell moved that snow removal on sidewalks be done on Main Street only and not in residential areas.

CARRIED UNAN.

Airport

It was noted that the Airport runways need to be cleared of snow. If they are not done a notam needs to be called in to advise when they will be cleared. Also salt and sand cannot be used on the runway.

Plowing of Streets

It was a concesus of Council to leave the plowing of streets up to the discretion of the Public Works Foreman, however if a snow fall of 5 to 6 inches occurs the streets should be plowed. Should be plowed to the middle of the street with no sanding on First Avenue or the Beacon Heights road. Council is thinking about having Carmac do the sanding down 6th Street and out First Avenue to Hiway #72 at a cost of \$110.00 per hour plus sand and GST.

Compost

The idea of having a trailer put in different areas for compost was discussed but was not approved by Council. Council would still like to have the compost area be at the transfer site.

Burn Pit

Public Works Foreman to go ahead with this idea.

Subdivision

A 24 inch culvert will be temporarily placed at the subdivision to allow for lumber trucks to come in. Also a load of crushed gravel will be placed temporarily over the curb on the west subdivision lots in order to put fill material used through the winter in that area.



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Garbage Truck

The garbage truck is working fine although there is a leak in one hydraulic cylinder.

Storm Ditches

Alberta Environment came to look over the ditch situation with the Public Works Foreman and Administrator. Some of the ditches especially the one running from 6th Street to Highway #9 and the ditch by the lift station need to be cleaned out of debris.

CN will be cleaning under their trestle on Highway #72, there are two culverts there that will be cleaned out by the M.D.

Res 96-122 A

Councillor Schmaltz moved to write a letter to the M.D. of Rocky View asking that they clean the ditch out by the sewer lagoon.

Campground

The campground is shut down and will be shut down in the future after the thanksgiving weekend instead of the end of October.

Airport

The furnace has been serviced and should work until the end of the winter at which time it is hoped that other arrangements will be made with regard to the terminal.

Transfer Site

The cylinder on the bin at the transfer site is leaking. The foreman will be looking at the hoses and the cylinder. Councillor Fegan advised him to phone Tammy Nygard to see about the possibility of getting cylinder replacements from Drumheller.

Seniors Grant

It looks like we will be receiving the \$1,000.00 Seniors Grant from Alberta Tourism Partnership after all. However the Program will be discontinued in 1997.

Bensons Industries

There was a misconception with regard to the \$500.00 cost from Bensons. This \$500.00 was to update our sewer lagoon application not to repair the splitter box. Council decided that they did not wish to pay the \$500.00 to have the report updated at this time.

AGRA Earth Environmental The Administrator reported that when the Geological Study is back from Environment we will be receiving a copy of all the information.

E911

The Administrator updated Council on changes that have happened since the past Council meeting. Medi-Fire has sold their building and will be working out of a private residence. Negotiated cost for rent will be discussed and Brian Cornforth of Airdrie Fire Department will advise the Administrator when this has been worked out.
