#### CALL TO ORDER

#### PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS

3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue Ditch

The ditch line on third avenue was discussed. The Village Foreman advised Council that two of the homeowners on Third Avenue were reluctant to have the grass ditch dug up in the ditch line.

The Public Works Committee will meet with the Village Foreman at the shop on Thursday at 9:00 A.M. to look at the ditches and possibly talk with the homeowners about the work.

Water Treatment Study A letter from the Kneehill Regional Water Commission regarding the Regional Water Study and inviting the Village of Beiseker to have input in this study at a cost of \$1.00 per capita and also to appoint one Councillor to the Commission.

Deputy Mayor Fegan moved to have the Village of Beiseker participate in the Regional Water Study. CARRIED UNAN.

**CPR** Building

The Public Works Foreman advised Council that Public Works will be taking one of the buildings on the CPR site and McNair Sand & Gravel will be removing all the rest.

Friendship Park

The buildings at Friendship Park need to be repaired as the roof shingles are coming off. Councillor Bell will talk to the Lions Club about repairing these roofs.

Culvert on 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue Culvert on 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue is three quarters blocked off, it currently houses an eighteen inch concrete storm pipe and the Village Foreman would like to dig it out and install a 12" pipe. About 45' of piping would be needed. Public Works Foreman advised to go ahead with this project.

Museum Lawn

The current lawn is dying, it needs something done to it. Council suggested aerating the lawn to see how that works out. Also the benches need to be repainted.

Fifth Street

The Mayor discussed the fact that grad will be held this weekend and we need to make sure that the contractors machinery and fifth street is not blocked for this weekend.

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Valve

The valve on 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue & 6<sup>th</sup> Street began leaking when the fire hydrant was used to divert water from 5<sup>th</sup> Street. It is not leaking any more but the foreman asked if it should be repaired at this time. Council agreed he should go ahead and repair it.

Friendship Park

Councillor Bell suggested that since we have trees left over that several need to go in at Friendship Park as well.

Summer Staff

The Public Works Foreman advised that the summer staff has been hired.
