Deputy Mayor Beagle moved to adopt the minutes of the Regular Meeting of Council of the Village of Beiscker held August 10, 1998. CARRIED UNAN.

Deputy Mayor Beagle moved to approve the minutes of the Assessment Review Board held August 27, 1998. CARRIED UNAN.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Councillor Bell moved to approve the Financial Statement as presented for the month ended August 31, 1998. CARRIED UNAN.

Kneehill Water Study

Mayor Fegan advised that there is some information that is needed for the Kneehill Water Study from Beiseker.

PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS

Foreman's Report

The sidewalk on 5th Street is almost completed although there are a few panels that need to be fixed where the private sidewalk joins on with the regular sidewalk. It was noted that the sidewalks were not rolled as had been requested.

Sidewalk 5th Street

Subdivision

The subdivision has been leveled. When the sewer lagoon is completed the remaining top soil will be used over there and it will be seeded to grass.

Beacon Heights

Beacon Heights Res. #98-50

Public Works Foreman reported on the condition of the pipe by the Beacon Heights playground and advised that he would like to close in the ditch there. Cost of the pipe would be \$1,882.24 or \$1,248.00 for a type of pipe called ultra rib. The Public Works Foreman recommended digging out 200 feet to replace the old pipe and then fill it in and seed as there would be a better grade and drainage in that area by doing that.

Deputy Mayor Beagle moved that if there is enough room in the budget that Public Works be instructed to complete the piping job in Beacon Heights using ultra rib pipe at CARRIED UNAN. a cost of \$1,248.00.

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Centennial Bldg.	The fence was moved at the Centennial Building and the fence post was put in at the firehall.
Arena	The roadway was built up beside the arena.
Ditch Cleaning	The ditch was cleaned behind Beacon Heights
Grader	The engine in the grader is blown. A quote was received from Waterous Detroit Diesel at a cost of \$12,408.00. Council felt that we should put the repair on hold due to the age of the grader and contract the work out for the rest of the year until Council decides what to do with the grader. In the meantime the Public Works Foreman will call different places to see what the market value of the grader would be without a motor.
Top soil hauling from the lagoon Res. #98-51	Councillor Schmaltz moved to go ahead and haul 200 loads of top soil from the lagoon and have Silversite do the job at \$26.00 per box but to hold off doing the work until the lagoon was completed. CARRIED UNAN.
CPR Station	The Public Works Foreman advised that the light bulbs at the Station are continually being broken. He asked about putting a spot light on the building instead.
	Deputy Mayor Beagle will take the suggestion to the Museum Board at their meeting in October.
Catch Basins	The catch basin on 6 th Street and 4 th Avenue has had a box built around it to help from the gravel burying it and causing drainage problems.
Fifth Avenue	Rocks were picked from Lampsons to Highway Service in the ditch lines in order that they can be mowed.
Village Shop	A new sign was installed at the Village shop.
Walkway Beacon Heights	The walkway in Beacon Heights is not quite finished yet and needs a little bit more fill.
Tree Pruning	There was some tree pruning done in Friendship Park.
Nova Gas	Al Jackmen from Nova Gas asked permission to put the steel shavings that result from doing their gas line work into our metal pile at the transfer station. Each shaving weights about 2000 lbs. It was suggested that Nova should contact the fellow from Irricana that deals in scrap metal and not to put it at the transfer station. Also to inform Nova Gas that they should be at least one foot between the two pipelines and that their pipeline should be below our waterline.
Fifth Street- Power Pole	Two street lights only are working and there was a concern expressed about the playground as far as lighting. The pole was removed from the Centennial Building when the lift station was taken out and moved by Friendship Park. Public Works Foreman to check the motion light behind the Centennial Building to see if it is working and to see how much area lights up hack there. Public Works Foreman to contact

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and to see how much area lights up back there. Public Works Foreman to contact TransAlta to help evaluate what lighting is needed on Fifth Street.

Public Works Foreman to walk with Heartland down the ditch line at the lagoon to see where the seepage is. A preliminary letter was discussed that has been signed by Mr. Clarence Schmaltz stating that he would give permission to clean the ditches on his property provided that the Village reimburse him for crop losses that he has had in the past years as a result of scepage problems.

Retarder Breaks	There was also some discussion about he use of retarder breaks in the Village. There appears to be only one sign. Public Works to contact Transportation to have more signs erected regarding retarder breaks.
Dianc Goodwin	Diane Goodwin read a letter to Council advising that she is concerned that her property may flood next Spring and that the culverts on 7 th Street and 3 rd Avenue have not been cleaned. She was assured that they would be cleaned.
	Public Works Foreman advised Council that the work is still on the list but it has not been completed yet. Also she discussed the fact that there are some unsightly lots on main street that need to have the weeds cut. Administration to look into this.
Carmacks	Administration advised Council that mixed sand and salt that was to be purchased from Carmacks now needs to be purchased prior to receiving the sand.
	Mayor Fegan moved to purchase 100 yds of sand/salt mixture from Carmacks and to prepay this amount. CARRIED UNAN.
Big Country Mall	It was noted that the Big Country Mall at the rear is very unsightly, there are tall weeds and grass, trees that need to be trimmed and garbage laying around that needs to be picked up. Administration to follow through on this.





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Beiseker/MD Rocky View Notification Zone

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9-5 ITEM#4 ali4190

The MD of Rocky View and the Village of Belseker agree to a notification process for circulation of:

- a) redesignation, subdivision and development applications; and/or
- b) area structure plan/area redevelopment plans, municipal development plan policies and other significant land use policies.

The purpose of the notification zones is to provide an opportunity for the respective municipalities to provide input on applications which may have an impact (e.g., land use, environmental, servicing, traffic).

Boundary options of the Notification Zones within the M.D. of Rocky View and the Village of Beiseker are shown on the attached Maps.

Within the M.D. of Rocky View notification zone the M.D. of Rocky View will circulate the following items to the Village of Belseker unless otherwise agreed in writing:

- all applications for land use redesignation;
- all applications for subdivision;
- applications for road closures;
- all development permit applications; and
- all draft land use policies and developments which may create local access issues and all other major applications or policies at the discretion of the M.D. or at the request of the Village of Beiseker.

On lands which abut the village boundary, Village of Beiseker will circulate the following items to the M.D. of Rocky View unless otherwise agreed in writing:

- all major applications for land use redesignation;
- applications for outline plans of subdivision only (i.e., no minor subdivision applications);
- only those applications for road closures that are judged by Village staff to have an impact of the M.D. of Rocky View;
- only those applications for development permits which may present significant compatibility concerns with adjacent land uses within the M.D. of Rocky View.

• all draft land use policies and developments which may create local access issues for the residents of the M.D. and all other major applications or policies at the discretion of the Village or at the request of the M.D.

Unless otherwise negotiated, written responses to any applications which are circulated by either the M.D. or Rocky View or the Village of Beiseker respectively are due within 30 days of the circulation date. If no response is received within 30 days of the circulation date the response may be considered as "no objections".

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
