#### CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Fegan called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

#### ADOPTION OF AGENDA

#### ADOPTION OF MINUTES

Deputy Mayor Beagle moved to adopt the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Council of the Village Beiseker held September 28, 1998 with the following amendment: On page 1 Under Resolution 98-62 after the word "ditch cleaning" add "before October 15"; Page #3 Legislative Assembly Alberta, Richard Marz spelling should be changed from "Marz to Maerz". ### FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Deputy Mayor Beagle moved to adopt the financial statement as presented for the month ended September 30, 1998. CARRIED UNAN.

#### PUBLIC WORKS REPORT

Grader

Silversite is not interested in the grader but McNair Sand & Gravel may be interested.

Ditch Cleaning

Heartland is going to be starting the ditch cleaning soon Silversite was not able to begin cleaning the ditch for several weeks.

Retarder Break Signs

A retarder break sign has been ordered. The cost will be \$507.00 for a 4'x 4' sign. A permit from Alberta Transportation & Utilities is not required if the sign is posted on Village property.

Beacon Heights Ditch The ditch at Beacon Heights by Beacon Heights Playground has been completed except for seeding. A second walkway was installed. The Public Works Foreman advised Council that some vehicles have tried to go across the pathway, even though it is too narrow they still attempt it. Council suggested that a post be put at the entrance and exit to each walkway.

Bottle Depot

The lot beside the bottle depot was cleaned of debris and the trees were trimmed and the grass was mowed.

Transfer Site

Public Works has started putting up the retaining wall at the transfer site.

Burn Pit

The items in the burn pit are being burnt.

Pumps

The pumps were sent into be checked and were returned as they could be checked on site.

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**Campground Closing** 

Some of the people at the campground have requested that the campground stay open until the end of October. Public Works will be digging tomorrow to repair the valve so that Friendship Park can be shut off leaving the comfort station open.

Council gave Public Works the go ahead to shut the campground at the end of October.

Faber Gurevitch Bickman A letter from Ben Gurevitch of Faber Gurevitch Bickman regarding the lot at 401 - 6<sup>th</sup> Street. Mr. Gurevitch, writing on behalf of Christine Yu, stated that the problem of mowing her lot seemed to be the result of winter snow and rocks that were moved onto her property.

Apparently when the maintenance crew removed the excess snow from the streets and byways of the Village. Some of it was deposited on this land and contained in the snow was litter of all sorts including stones of various sizes and when the snow melts the refuge remains on the property. Mr. Gurevitch advised that upon its removal the Yu's will be in a position to keep it mowed.

Administration to write a letter advising that Public Works had already removed the stones off the lot and had moved it once and from this point on it was supposed to be the responsibility of the Yu's.

**Tennis Courts** 

The Public Works Foreman advised that the tennis courts are in poor repair and that the fence posts are coming out of the ground and that it would need to be re-augered and replaced in order to repair the fence.

The Public Works foreman advised that himself, the recreation director and the Maintenance person from Rockyview School Division had met to discuss the problem with the tennis courts.

Administration to write a letter to the school board regarding the tennis courts and advising that Council are not opposed to the fence being taken down and the tennis courts being used as a basketball court.

Benson's Industries

Council received a copy of the letter to A & A Paving from Benson's Industries regarding the deficiencies on Fifth Street.

Public Works advised to keep on getting these deficiencies completed, especially the road work on 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue blending into 5<sup>th</sup> Street as well as 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue on to 5<sup>th</sup> Street.

At this time Public Works advised that the caretaker for the arena was interested in the fencing that had been taken down and asked if the Village did not need it, if he could have the old fencing. Council agreed to let him have the old fencing as we are not in need of it.

Wade Stern

A letter from Wade Stern to Council requesting permission to dump sewage into the Beiseker lagoon from vacuum truck services provided in Beiseker and area.
