PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS (Continued)

- (a) Foreman Bramley contacted Canadian Public Auction to establish a price for our grader. After contacting them a second time they confirmed that is was worth \$5,000 to \$7,000 as is. Alberta Transportation have has been contacted and when they have a single axle diesel truck equipped with a plough and sander, they will let us know price and location. This may be a possible substitute for our grader.
