Medi-Fire

Pat Dexter and Sherry Stopa, representing Medi-Fire came to Council to update them on 9-1-1. A.G.T. is having some problems with selective call routing and will not be applying to the CRTC until the problems are ironed out which will probably be about the third quarter of this year. The purchase of a piece of equipment was discussed in lieu of money in the interim until 9-1-1 comes on line. If the Village wants Medi-Fire to be the call point for Fire it would cost \$2.75 per capita once the trial period was over. Medical calls are already being routed through Medi-Fire and the cost is covered under our Ambulance Agreement with the City of Airdrie.
