#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Taylor called the meeting to order at 7:05 P.M.

#### **ADOPTION OF AGENDA**

Deputy Mayor Beagle moved to adopt the Agenda with the deletion under Delegations - #1 Lisa Murphy and #3 Benson Industries. CARRIED UNAN.

#### **ADOPTION OF MINUTES**

Mayor Taylor moved that the minutes of the Regular Meeting of Council and the Public Hearing held April 24, 1995 be approved.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Deputy Mayor Beagle moved to approve the Financial Statement as presented.

#### **PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS**

Boots

The Policy on boot purchase for Public Works was discussed. Administration to look back in the Minutes for a policy as to maximum amount allowed and how often they can be purchased.

Zoche/Schmaltz

The catch basin has raised up six inches and the advice of Jock Wilson was to dig out the area in order to see exactly what the problem is. It is suspected that the ground was not properly compacted on installation and this is the cause of the problem.

Council would like to think about this project and decide at a later date what course they wish to take.

Culvert Repair

The lump was knocked off were the culvert had raised up in the road. The Public Works Foreman will leave the area for about two weeks to allow for traffic to compact the area and then he will gravel the low spots after that.

Water to Shop

The Public Works Foreman suggested an alternate route to install water at the shop which would consist of burying two tanks, one for water and one for sewer in the ground at a cost of approximately \$4,500.00.

Council would like to wait for now to see what happens with the other projects that need to be dealt with first before making a decision on proceeding with this project.

Directional Signs

Public Works will be renting Donovan Hagel's bobcat and auger to install the Directional signs and will be working on the afternoon of May 10, 1995.

Chain Link Fence

Quotes on chain link fence were discussed. Allen Bramley to check on quotes with installation costs removed before deciding where to order the material.

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**Soft Spots** 

Deputy Mayor Beagle advised that she noticed two soft spots on 6th Avenue across from the Wheat Pool. Public Works to check this out and remedy the situation before it becomes worse.

Grader

Grant Summach of Bow River Paving approached the Public Works Foreman about the possibility of renting the Grader for the paving project at the Arena.

Council has a policy not to rent equipment however if Public Works ran the equipment Council would have no objection to the use of the Grader. Allen Bramley to check his work schedule to see if they would be time available to do this work.

Trailer

Allen Bramley informed Council that he has fabricated a trailer to haul the mower from an old one at the Shop.

Transfer Site

Cou. Van Hee thanked Public Works for cutting down the road at the Transfer Site to accommodate the larger truck. The lip hasn't been welded yet.

Allen Bramley to check with Bruce Schmaltz to see if he could borrow his welding truck to do the job.

S.T.E.P.

The Village has been approved for S.T.E.P. students again this year. Advertising should go out in the paper soon.

Transfer Site

The Public Works Foreman would like to see the grass burned at the Transfer Site and has been unable to coordinate with the Fire Chief to have it done. He will continue to pursue the project.

Sewer Line

The Sewer line at 230 - 7th Street is plugged into the Street. Thuro will be coming May 9, 1995 to camera the line.

Infrastructure Project The Administrator advised the Canada/Alberta Infrastructure Works Program has been frozen for the time being to allow the Federal Government to make a decision on funding for the extension of the program for an additional two years and how that will impact on the current year's budget. There are 257 projects waiting for approval, the Village's two projects among them. The Administrator has been assured that the Federal Government will make their decision within the next two weeks.

Council decided that under the circumstances they would table the projects for now until they know what the outcome of the Infrastructure funding is.

They also decided to hold off paving the Village Office Parking Lot for now.

**Test Holes** 

The test holes that were dug for the new subdivision project have not been filled in. Public Works instructed to fill these in.

School Zone Sign

Cou. Bell asked about School Zone Signs. The Village usually handled putting them up. Public Works was instructed to erect a School Zone Sign on the road by the Post Office.

**BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES** 

CN Property

The Administrator advised that she had contacted Ron Sawchuk, CN Real Estate Department, asking why CN didn't get back to the Village regarding the offer to purchase for \$75.00 per acre. Apparently Mr. Sawchuk did not receive our offer and was subsequently faxed a copy of the same. Mr. Sawchuk informed the Administrator that CN would still like \$100.00 per acre.

**CN Property** 

Administration will check on the acreage involved and if it is not more than

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three acres, to send another offer to CN. If they are not willing to accept \$75.00 per acre then the Village would pay \$100.00 per acre.

Centennial Building 95-45

Deputy Mayor Beagle moved to amend the Centennial Building Policy by deleting the words "unless under long-term contract" and replacing with "or at the Discretion of Council".

Council Chambers 95-46

Cou. Van Hee moved to establish a policy for use of Council Chambers as follows:

Council Chambers are to be for the sole use of Council. Any groups or committees of Council wishing to use Council Chambers or who have been using Council Chambers in the past will be referred to the Centennial Building for use once it has been painted and cleaned.

The Administrator reported that Transportation has not made a decision as to who would receive title to the Airport and would like the M.D. and Beiseker to work together to make this decision.

Deputy Mayor Beagle and the Administrator will work together on a presentation to be made at the M.D. council. The Administrator will write a letter to the M.D. asking to be slotted for a time to come to Council as a delegation.

Cou. Van Hee moved to use Brisbin & Sentis to process subdivision applications on behalf of the Village.
