Mayor Fegan moved to approve the Financial Statement for the month ending May CARRIED UNAN. 2003.

### **DELEGATIONS**

In Camera Joe Mercier & Jim Mercier and Robert Burgerner, Solicitor for Para Aerosvc. Inc.

Councillor Rowe moved that Council go in camera @ 7:33 p.m. with the delegation of Joe Mercier & Jim Mercier of Para Aerosvc. Inc. and Robert Burgerner, Solicitor for Para Aeroscv. Inc. to discuss their lease at the Beiseker Airport.

Reconvene

Councillor Priestman moved that Council reconvene from <u>in camera</u> @ 8:22 p.m. CARRIED UNAN.

Council took a short recess between 8:22 p.m. and 8:30 p.m.

Jason Finner, Urban Systems Ltd.

Jason Finner discussed with Council the 2003 Municipal Sponsorship Grant and the suggestion to apply for grant funding to complete a water and sewer model for the Village of Beiseker as the first stage in the preparation of a long range planning study for the Village of Beiseker. The Village of Beiseker is eligible for approximately \$16,300.00 under the enhanced grant. The study would include a current and future water and sewer model. Should this grant continue to be available in future years, this long range planning study could be expanded to include roads, buildings and mobile equipment.

Res. #2003- 54

Mayor Fegan moved that Urban Systems Ltd. prepare a grant application on behalf of the Village of Beiseker under the 2003 Municipal Sponsorship Grant for a water and sewer model long range planning study. CARRIED UNAN.

Mr. Finner also reviewed with Council the status of the 7<sup>th</sup> Street sidewalk replacement project, 9<sup>th</sup> Street paving and the MIMS project.



### **PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS**

Roads

The Public Works Foreman advised Council that the roads had been dustproofed using a Mg30 base stabilization product.

Curbs & Crosswalks

The Public Works Foreman advised Council that the curbs and crosswalks had all been repainted.

Sweeper

The Public Works Foreman advised Council that the clutch was replaced in the sweeper

Grass Cutting & weedeating

The Public Works Foreman advised Council that the Public Works staff had been busy cutting grass and weedeating in preparation for Sport's Day.

Backalleys

The Public Works Foreman advised Council that the Public Works staff would be starting to regrade the backalleys starting the week of June 9, 2003. Weeds in the backalleys were sprayed on June 9, 2003.

1 Ton Truck

The Public Works Foreman advised Council that a Department of Transportation Officer had stopped Cory King while driving the 1 ton truck for not wearing a seatbelt. The Officer then proceeded to perform an inspection of the truck and the Officer ordered that the 1 ton truck was no longer permitted to leave the Village of Beiseker limits unless a considerable amount of mechanical work including headlamps, shocks, drums etc. was performed on the truck. The Public Works Foreman provided Council with estimates for this mechanical work for an approximate amount of \$2,370.00. Council stated that the 1 ton truck must only be used within the Village of Beiseker limits as it would not be cost effective to have these repairs done to this truck.

Centennial Playground Councillor Priestman advised the Public Works Foreman that Peggy MacKenzie of the Beiseker Playschool will be requesting the assistance of the Public Works staff to remove unsafe playground equipment from the Centennial Playground. The Public Works Foreman advised that arrangements have already been made with Mrs. MacKenzie in that regard.

CPR Station

Councillor Priestman noted that the broken post at the bottom of the stairs had not yet been replaced. The Public Works Foreman advised Council that he has a 6" x 6" post at the shop painted and ready to be installed.

Sport's Day

Council requested that Administration send a thank you letter to Scott Wells for volunteering to wear the Squirt mascot costume during the Sport's Day Parade.

### NEW BUSINESS

### **COUNCILLORS REPORTS**

### Priestman Candidate's Forum

Councillor Priestman advised Council that he was unable to attend the Candidate's Forum on June 5, 2003 due to a family commitment.

Rockyview Foundation Councillor Priestman advised Council that he recently attended a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Rockyview Foundation. The Board has been conducting a review of the Foundation's policies.

### Rowe

Vibrant Communities Symposium

Councillor Rowe thanked Council for allowing him to attend the Atco Gas Vibrant Communities Symposium in Heisler. There were number of very good presentations on many types of community initiatives including the Boomtown Trail, Donalda's Lamr to name a few. There was also a presentation on a trail system west of Cold Lake involving a number of urban and rural municipalities.

#### **AUMA**

Councillor Rowe advised Council that the AUMA will be offering a risk management program specifically designed for the smaller municipalities at the 2003 AUMA Convention and there was some discussion concerning who should be attending these seminars. The Administrator advised Council that it was her intention to attend these risk management seminars on behalf of the Village of Beiseker.

#### RT Joint Venture

Councillor Rowe advised Council that to date he has been unable to contact Mr. Jim. Strilchuk who is the solicitor for Trouth Agencies. He advised Council that he will continue to pursue the matter.

### Economic Development & Tourism

Councillor Rowe advised Council that he is impressed with the Village Informer's new format and name change to the Beiseker Mainline Express as designed by our Economic Development Officer Tanya Klappe.

Councillor Rowe also advised Council that Tanya Klappe arranged for LaFarge Construction to donate the delivery charge for the concrete for the tourist booth pad, but that the Village will be responsible to cover the actual cost of the concrete.



### Courtman

Tire Recycling

Deputy Mayor Courtman thanked Council for sending him to the Tire Recycling banquet. Alberta now recycles over 4 million tires per year and is also now accepting tires from the Yukon Territories. Recycled tires are primarily made into rubber crumb for use in playgrounds as it has been found to be better than pea gravel. Other products such as rubber mats. water troughs and paving bricks are also made from recycled tires. Most of our recycled products are exported out of the Province.

Unlicensed Vehicles

Deputy Mayor Courtman provided Council with a proposal for either a new by-law or as an amendment to an existing by-law dealing with the issue of unlicensed vehicles being parked in residential areas. Council and Administration were asked to review the proposal and to provide input at the next regular meeting of Council.

Senior's Tea

Deputy Mayor Courtman advised Council that the Museum Society will be holding their annual Senior's Tea on Wednesday, June 18, 2003. Deputy Mayor Courtman will be speaking on the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of fixed wing powered aviation.

Airport

Deputy Mayor Courtman advised Council that a survey crew has now surveyed and staked the area for temporary taxiway #3. Each of the individual lots along temporary taxiway #3 was also staked. Deputy Mayor Courtman will now need to co-ordinate with our Public Works Foreman as to the work that now needs to be done to construct a temporary taxiway #3.

Deputy Mayor Courtman advised Council that he and the CAO had a meeting on May 28, 2003 with the M.D. of Rockyview regarding property taxes at the airport. This was a very productive meeting and a number of problems regarding the levying of taxes on the airport lots were resolved.

RT Joint Venture/ Development Venture.

Mayor Fegan advised Council that the CAO wrote an excellent letter to the Urban Development Institute of Alberta with respect to Resland Development and RT Joint Venture.

Mayor Fegan advised Council that he would be meeting with Debbie McIssac who is the realtor for RT Joint Venture/Resland Development on June 10, 2003.

Kneehill Regional Water Committee

Mayor Fegan advised Council that the next meeting of the Kneehill Regional Water Committee will be held on June 12, 2003.

By-Election

Unserviced Lots

The Administrator advised Council that at the last regular meeting of Council held on May 24, 2003, Council discussed implementing a policy whereby if there were any unserviced lots on a street or avenue that was scheduled for paving, that those lots must be serviced prior to that street or avenue being paved. The Administrator provided Council with a draft copy of Policy #G-9 for their consideration.

Res. #2003-55

Deputy Mayor Courtman moved to adopt Policy #G-9 to ensure that any lot on any unpaved street or avenue that has not been serviced with water and sewer must be serviced prior to pavement and/or curb & gutter being installed. CARRIED UNAN.

Beiseker Airport

The Administrator advised Council that on May 28, 2003, Deputy Mayor Courtman and herself met with Ted Boyda and Brian Waters of the Assessment Department at the M.D. of Rockyview regarding the assessment of taxes on vacant lots/unleased lots at the airport by the M.D. of Rockyview. The meeting was very beneficial and successful for both parties as we were able to address a number of issues and come to an understanding regarding the airport property and the matter of property taxes.



LGAA Government Dialogue Workshop

The Administrator provided for Council's consideration, an Agenda for an upcoming Government Dialogue Workshop on June 25, 2003 being sponsored by the Local Government Administration Association. With Council's permission, the Administrator asked to attend this workshop. The Administrator noted that this workshop is also open to any non-member of the LGAA should any Councillor be interested in attending.

2003 Budget

The Administrator advised Council that the office staff has received some comments on the fact that the Village Office is not open during the hours of 12 noon to 1 p.m. The office staff has indicated that they would have no objections to adjusting their work schedules to accommodate the Village Office being open over the lunch hour. The Administrator advised Council that the Town of Okotoks Municipal Office is open until 8:00 p.m. one night per week to accommodate those residents that are unable to come into the office during regular business hours. Council asked the Administrator to include a survey question in the next utility bills and Village Informer asking residents for their comments on revised office hours.
