Affordable Housing	Councillor Rowe advised Council that he had been in contact with a company that was interested in developing the remaining residential subdivision previously owned by RT Joint Venture. Their contact information was passed along to the current owner of the property. The company was proposing to move in homes that were located at Sarcee Barracks. All of the homes would be totally refurbished. The development would be 50% rentals and 50% owner occupied. This development was originally intending to locate in Crossfield. Councillor Rowe advised Council that he was informed that these homes were to be sold by July 30, 2004 otherwise they would be demolished. Councillor Rowe further advised Council that he tried to follow-up with the company without success.

Darren also informed the Administrator that Alberta Environment was going to be using the services of Interra Environmental (Barry Lesiuk) as they are already very familiar with this site from the emergency response work that was done on Village property.

The Administrator advised Council that she phoned Carol Haley's office to thank her for her quick action on this matter and that she will be following-up that phone call with a formal thank you letter.


