#### **CALL TO ORDER**

#### **PUBLIC WORKS ITEMS**

As the Public Works Foreman was on holidays, Public Works Staff Ward Kisko attended the meeting in his absence.

Mr. Kisko advised Council that the Public Works Staff had completed the following tasks:

- finished applying cold mix to 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Avenues;
- cleaned the ditches along 8<sup>th</sup> Street;
- cleaned up weeds along Beacon Heights Road;
- cleaned up the caraganas along 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue;
- installed a pole and light by the transfer station bins;
- placed cold mix and repaired low spots behind the arena; and
- cut in a culvert to create an access to the 2005 Railway Museum site.



Mr. Kisko further advised Council that the following tasks were on the work list to be completed:

- finish filling low spots on Chinook Road and Chinook Crescent with cold mix;
- patching the vents on the CPR Station; and
- replace concrete sidewalk on Chinook Crescent.

#### **Tourist Booth**

Councillor Rowe advised Mr. Kisko that the tourist booth lot needs a large number of loads of topsoil in preparation for sod that is to be delivered within the next two weeks and asked if the Public Works Staff could have that done the week of August 9, 2004.

Councillor Hnybida moved to approve account cheque #20040664 to D.L.F. Holdings Ltd. in the amount of \$28.39.

Mayor Fegan abstained from voting or commenting on the above item.

#### **DELEGATIONS**

Jason Finner, Urban Systems re Sidewalk Design Jason Finner advised Council that the overall sidewalk design plan for 7<sup>th</sup> Street, 8<sup>h</sup> Street, 9<sup>th</sup> Street and 2<sup>nd</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> Avenues was now complete. Grades have been a real challenge to ensure adequate drainage. Each intersection will act as the low spot for drainage. It should be possible to eliminate the ditches along 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenues between 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> Streets and replace them with short sections of storm sewer. The ditch will likely need to remain on 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue between 7th & 8th Streets, but this can again be reviewed at a later date. Mr. Finner will prepare the tender documents for the 3 blocks of sidewalk on the north side of 7<sup>th</sup> Street to see what interest can be generated from contractors. It is possible that it may be too late in the season to have this work completed in 2004 and therefore may need to be delayed until the spring of 2005.

Skyland Industrial Park

Jason Finner advised Council that he has been in contact with ISL to obtain the information that ISL has for the surface drainage for Skyland Industrial Park. Mr. Finner advised Council that he would attempt to contact Miles McNair of Silver Site Construction to ascertain a time frame when Silver Site would be available to complete the servicing of the Skyland Industrial Park.

Rollie Stroub, Campground Manager re Village Staff Mayor Fegan advised Mr. Stroub that decorum with Village Staff must at all times be observed especially in public. Mayor Fegan indicated that he was referencing an incident that took place in the Village Office approximately a month ago involving the Administrator and the Community Services Co-Ordinator. Mayor Fegan advised Mr. Stroub that the Community Services Co-Ordinator has requested a formal written apology and he requested that Mr. Stroub provide this apology as soon as possible. Mr. Stroub then apologized to the Administrator.

Barbed Wire on Chain Link Fence

Mayor Fegan advised Mr. Stroub that the barbed wire on the chain link fence between the campground and the ball diamonds needs to be removed. Council instructed Mr. Stroub to either contact the company that installed the fence or speak with the Public Works Foreman to determine if the Public Works Staff could remove the barbed wire from the fence.

Campground Washrooms

Mayor Fegan advised Mr. Stroub that he was still receiving reports that travellers who were not registered campground guests were being denied use of the washrooms at the campground by Mr. Stroub. Mr. Stroub advised Council that this was simply not the case and that a large number of travellers stop on a daily basis to use the washroom facilities. Mayor Fegan stressed that the washrooms at the campground are public facilities.

Picnic Tables

Councillor Priestman enquired of Mr. Stroub about the picnic tables that were to have been brought over to Friendship Park for the Summer Fun Day Camp. Mr. Stroub advised Council that he took over 3 picnic tables to Friendship Park only to be told by one of the summer staff that the tables were no longer needed. Councillor Priestman asked Mr. Stroub if he would still please move a couple of picnic tables to Friendship Park.

Ladies Washroom

Mr. Stroub advised Council that the tiles in the ladies washroom at the campground are lifting and should be replaced. Mr. Stroub requested permission to have the tiles in the ladies washroom replaced at a cost of approximately \$1,400.00.

#### **COUNCILLORS REPORTS**

Priestman
Drinking Water

Councillor Priestman advised Council that he recently read an article in the "Forum" magazine titled "Break the Connection: Protect Your Drinking Water" and recommended that Council should also read this story dealing with cross-connections and drinking water.



Arena Lease

Councillor Priestman advised Council that he spoke with Fran Hagel regarding the preparation of a new lease agreement with the Beiseker & District Ag Society related to the operation of the arena. Councillor Priestman advised Council that Ms. Hagel will be reviewing the lease and will provide suggestions for any amendments to the original lease document.

### Rowe Tourist Booth

Councillor Rowe advised Council that the rubber pathway at the Tourist Booth is to be done over again. The EDC Committee has decided not to move the trees from the Public Works Shop in part due to the cost and has instead decided to lay grass sod first before planting any trees. Donna Tumak has a number of trees on her acreage that she is willing to donate for the Tourist Booth Park.

Lawn Watering

Councillor Rowe advised Council that he gathered some information from the internet suggesting that it was better to water lawns during the morning or afternoon hours rather than the evening hours as permitted in our Outdoor Watering By-Law. The Administrator advised Council that a number of residents have enquired about being able to water during the early morning hours as opposed to the evening hours of 8:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. and these residents have been advised that was satisfactory. The purpose behind the Outdoor Watering By-Law is to restrict the watering of lawns during daytime hours on hot or windy days when the water will only evaporate.

#### Hnybida CPR Station Roof

Councillor Hnybida advised Council that Morris Roofing inspected the roof on the CPR Station and advised that the roof should still have a life expectancy of another 10 years.

Cemetery

Councillor Hnybida advised Council that a work bee has been scheduled at the cemetery for Saturday, August 14, 2004.

### Fegan New Restaurant

Mayor Fegan advised Council that the owners of the new Beefsteak Restaurant would like to erect a couple of signs on Highway #9 one on the south side of the Skyland Industrial Park and another east of the Highway #9, Highway #72 and Highway #806 intersection. Approval would be required from Alberta Transportation. Councillor Rowe advised Council that he would be in opposition of placing such a sign in the Skyland Industrial Park.

Kneehill Regional Water Services

Mayor Fegan advised Council that the Commission has applied for an additional \$600,000.00 in funding from the Provincial Government for extras on the project. The three contractors are doing well. The supply line contract from Drumheller is slightly behind schedule, however, the other 2 contracts are on schedule. The Land has been cleared for the reservoir site in Drumheller. Two meetings are scheduled in September 2004 at which time the municipal contracts will be started.
