Deputy Mayor Courtman advised Council that in discussions with residents during his election campaign the main issue has been specific unsightly premises on main street.

Fire Department

Deputy Mayor Courtman advised Council that on October 7, 2004 he attended the Beiseker Fire Department's Annual Open House for Fire Prevention Week. The Fire Department demonstrated the use of rescue equipment such as their scoop stretcher, chair stretcher and Kendricks device.

Mayor Fegan advised Council that he attended a meeting of the Wild Rose Economic Development Corporation on October 7, 2004. The WREDC has decided to hire Karen Heisler to do a regional asset directory. The WREDC is also working on a privacy policy manual. On October 22, 2004 the WREDC will be hosting a function for Small Business Week.

The WREDC discussed at length proposed motions from the Entre-Corp Business Development Centre Board of Directors to address the issue of some Alberta CFDC's having surplus investment funds and others having reasonable access to reasonable excess funding. The issue of excess funds is expected to become an issue at the next round of contract negotiations between the Alberta CF Network and Western Diversification. A small number of Alberta CFDC's such as Entre-Corp. are in need of investment funds to meet their current demand to continue the lending function. Currently, access to investment funds is provided through borrowings from the Community Futures Loan Investment Pool Program and other local arrangements. This is a program whereby CFDC's can pool excess funds and receive a better than bank return. Those without can borrow at bank prime rate. Entre-Corp is proposing a motion to the Community Futures Network Society of Alberta whereby Western Diversification would reallocate repayable investment funds from those CFDC's who can demonstrate the need for their surplus funds in the near future. The needs assessment would have to be realistic based on history and future fact based projections.

Kneehill Regional Water Services Commission Mayor Fegan advised Council that the next meeting of the Kneehill Regional Water Commission is scheduled for October 14, 2004.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Highway 9 Grade-Widening

The Administrator advised Council that Alberta Transportation has sent out an invitation to attend a Stakeholder's Meeting to review the design of the Highway #9 grade-widening project. The project limits are from north of Highway #1 to approximately 3 km north of Highway #566 (Kathryn-Balzac Road). This meeting is scheduled to be held at the offices of Alberta Transportation for Tuesday, October 19, 2004 @ 1:00 p.m. at:

2nd floor, Willowglen Business Park 803 Manning Road N.E., Calgary, Alberta

Skyland Industrial Park The Administrator asked if any Councillor was interested in attending this meeting, to please let her know in order that she may RSVP to Alberta Transportation. Deputy Mayor Courtman advised Council that he would attend this meeting on behalf of the Village of Beiseker.

The Administrator advised Council that Jason Finner of Urban Systems has arranged a meeting with Miles McNair of Silver Site Construction together with the Administrator and Dale to review the plans for the servicing of the Skyland Industrial Park. This meeting has been scheduled for Thursday, October 14, 2004 commencing at 9:00 a.m. in the Council Chambers. All members of Council are also very welcome to attend this meeting. Councillor Rowe had already indicated that he would be in attendance.

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Upgrade of Campground Transformer

The Administrator advised Council that at the request of our campground Manager Rollie Stroub, that she had made enquiries with Fortis Alberta to have the transformer at the campground upgraded. The Administrator provided Council with a letter from Fortis Alberta in this regard. The Administrator advised Council that there will be no charge from Fortis for the transformer upgrade. If the transformer is upgraded, there will be a cost attributable for an electrician to make whatever changes are required at the panel box in the comfort station. Mr. Stroub has indicated that the electrician's costs would be in the area of \$1,000.00. However, this is an estimated cost only.

In speaking with Fortis, they advised that the existing transformer is a 10kva transformer with a 9kw capacity. Demand numbers show that the campground has peaked at 23.81 kw which is well above the capacity of the existing transformer. Fortis is recommending upgrading the existing transformer to a 50kva, which would provide more than enough capacity.

Councillor Rowe discussed with the Administrator that his estimate to upgrade the service panel in the comfort station would be in the area of \$2,000.00 to \$3,000.00. Council instructed Administration to obtain 3 quotes for this electrical work before any work is done to upgrade the transformer.

Request for Variance

The Administrator provided for Council's consideration, a letter from Alley Hassen requesting a variance for his newly constructed garage which encroaches on the front corner by 24" into a 3.0m (9.84ft.) URW registered on his property. Mr. Hassen's neighbour to the south also has a 3.0m URW on his property. The total width of the actual URW is 6.0m or 19.68 feet. The URW was registered for the purpose of protecting the water and sewer lines that run under this utility corridor.

The Administrator advised Council that she had discussed this matter with our Planning Advisor Karl Nemeth and he advised that this is a common occurrence and in instances such as this, the proper procedure is to enter into an Encroachment Agreement with the property owner as opposed to simply "granting a variance". The Encroachment Agreement is then registered on Mr. Hassen's property by way of a Caveat. The Administrator provided for Council's information and consideration a draft copy of both the Encroachment Agreement and Caveat. The Administrator advised Council that for the granting of the Encroachment Agreement, Mr. Hassen should be responsible for all Land Titles registrations costs associated therewith.

The Administrator advised Council that both Mr. Hassen and his builder were well aware of this URW being registered on the property before the garage was constructed. She further advised that she had had a number of conversations with Mr. Hassen about the possibility of relocating the garage or making the garage smaller to avoid any encroachment. The Encroachment Agreement does release the Village from any liability in the event of the removal or damage to the encroachment as a result of the Village requiring access to the URW easement.

Council instructed the Administrator to conduct a survey of other municipalities with respect to the fees charged by them for Encroachment Agreement fees for the purpose of drafting a policy to implement an administration fee for future Encroachment Agreements.

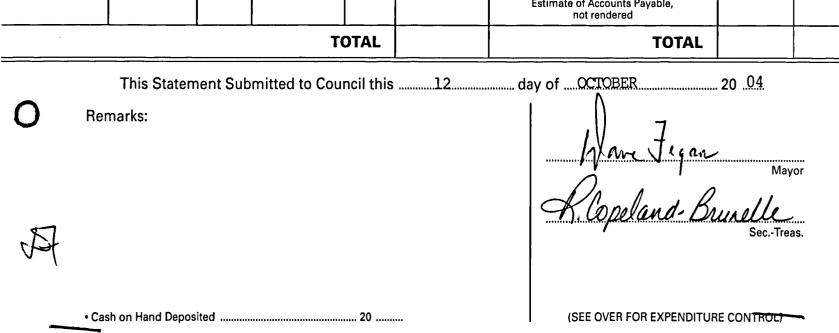
