SPRING CLEAN UP TIME



It's that time of year to start your spring property clean ups!! We want our community to look as good as it can. This means following the community standards bylaw which can be found at www.beiseker.com under bylaws-policies . Some of the items included in the Community Standards Bylaw are,

- No OWNER or Occupant of a PREMISES shall fail to CONTROL **GRASS** , trees, saplings, shrubs, and any **WEEDS** on their PREMISES.
- No OWNER or Occupant of a PREMISES shall allow that PROPERTY to become or continue to be **Unightly** or a **Nuisance** as defined in this Bylaw.
- No OWNER or Occupant of a RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY shall be permitted to keep a VEHICLE , RECREATIONAL VEHICLE or UTILITY TRAILER outside of a building on the PREMISES unless the VEHICLE, RECREATIONAL VEHICLE or UTILITY TRAILER is parked on an **Approved Parking Pad**.
- No OWNER or Occupant of a PREMISES shall fail to ensure that **ALLEYWAYS** that are adjacent to the PROPERTY are kept clear of LITTER, WEEDS, grass, VEHICLES, or any type of STRUCTURE.

May is Motorcycle Safety Month! Here are some Safety tips and Stats .

Motorcycle visibility ! Avoid blind spots - Wear safety gear which can be seen.



Helmets! A Full-Face Coverage Helmet is always recommended, and your helmet must meet the standards for motorcycle safety helmets .

Right Equipment ! Eye protection - Ear protection – Motorcycle riding Jacket, Pants, and Gloves – Appropriate Boots and Footwear.

Interesting Stats:

- Motorcycle riders are 28 times more likely to die and four times more likely to be injured in an accident compared with those in a passenger car.
- 34% of Motorcycle Fatalities Involve Speeding
- 27% of Motorcycle Accident Deaths Involved Alcohol
- 76% of Motorcycle Accidents Are Collisions from the Front (Head On)
- On the Weekend, the Most Common Time of Day When Motorcycle Fatalities Occur Is 6 p.m. to 9 p.m.
- During the Week, the Most Common Time of Day When Motorcycle Fatalities Occur Is 3 p.m. and 6 p.m.
- Motorcycle Accident Fatalities Have increased 20% Over the Last Decade

Remember to Ride Smart! Don't ride tired or impaired, and stay alert to road conditions, Intersections , Speed Limits, Other Road users and Wildlife. Give yourself and other drivers enough space to react. Keep the rubber side down !

Besides Council, administration and the presenters, there were about 25 people in attendance. There were a number of questions/suggestions raised:

- The need for proper crosswalk painting and signage at the crosswalks on First Avenue in particular. Public Works is arranging to have the signs installed and the line painting will take place as soon as weather and time permits.
- 9th Street Repairs – The Village is working with our engineers to at least scope the cost and design for street widening and underground infrastructure in the first block of 9th Street (between 1st and 2nd Avenue). Given the costs associated with this kind of construction, we will need to work on this project over the next few years.
- Enforcement – One of the audience members had a question with regard to the amount of time our Tri-Community Peace Officer spends in the office. The PO's time and activities are monitored and reported regularly. There is a significant administrative role that all enforcement officers have with regard to the proper filing of documents, etc. that requires time in the office to complete.
- Community Links – There were a couple of concerns raised about the reduced time that this organization is spending in Beiseker to offer services. This was addressed by Brenda Hume, Director and the staff present from Community Links. There is an ongoing effort to provide services in conjunction with available staffing and funding.

BUSINESS LICENSE/PERMITS

DO YOU HAVE A BUSINESS IN TOWN?

Whether it is a home-based business or a brick and mortar business, you must have a business permit to operate your business in Beiseker. All permits must be applied for at the Village Office.



IF YOU PLAN TO:

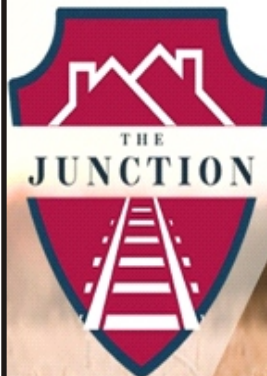
1. Construct any type of building regardless of size or use;
2. Develop any property;
3. Make any additions/renovations to an existing structure;
4. Add/change or alter gas, plumbing, electrical or building;
5. Build a deck or fence; or install a swimming pool...

YOU MUST:

Contact the Village Office as you may be required to apply for a Development Permit, Building Permit, Gas Permit, Plumbing Permit or Electrical Permit. Any development or construction that begins prior to being granted approval will result in a Stop Work Order and a fine.

What is FCSS (Family and Community Support Services)?

This is a Provincial Grant Program in partnership between the Government of Alberta and participating Municipalities and Metis Settlements to design and deliver local preventative social services to improve the well-being of individuals, families and communities.

What are the FCSS Prevention Strategies?

- Promote and Encourage Active Engagement in the Community
- Foster a Sense of Belonging (Community or Individual)
- Promote Social Inclusion
- Develop and Maintain Healthy Relationships
- Enhance Access to Social Supports
- Develop and Strengthen Skills that Build Resilience

What is the FCSS Mandate? (Programs must do one or more of the following):

- Help people to develop independence, strengthen coping skills and become more resilient to crisis
- Help people to develop interpersonal and groups skills which will enhance constructive relationships amongst people
- Help people develop awareness of social needs
- Help people and communities to assume responsibility for decisions and actions which affect them
- Provide Supports that help sustain people as active participants in their community

Where does the Funding come from to deliver FCSS programs, services or events?

The Government of Alberta Contributes 80% of the Funding towards the FCSS Program. The Village of Beiseker contributes a minimum of 20% as per the FCSS agreement.

Why do I have to fill out a Survey when I attend an FCSS Program or Event?

Outcomes and Measurements are a major part of the reporting process with FCSS. Surveys are a valuable tool to report on program objectives, community impact, volunteerism, community need and opportunities for continuous improvement.

What programs are eligible and what programs are ineligible under FCSS and who can apply?

Eligible Programs (as stated in the FCSS Mandate):

- Help people to develop independence, strengthen coping skills, and become more resistant to crisis
- Help people develop an awareness to social needs
- Help people to develop interpersonal and group skills which enhance constructive relationships amongst people
- Help people and communities to assume responsibility for decisions and actions which affect them
- Provide supports that help sustain people as active participants in their community

Ineligible Programs:

- Offer programs that are primarily for recreation needs or leisure pursuits
- Offer direct assistance, including money, food, clothing or shelter to sustain an individual or family
- Be primarily rehabilitative in nature
- Duplicate services that are already provided by government or a government agency
- Funding cannot cover operational costs that are not directly aligned with the FCSS program

The majority of FCSS programs, events and services are offered FREE or at a subsidized rate.
