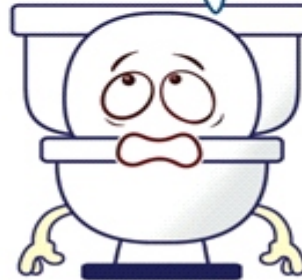

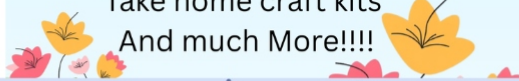

SMS Text Alerts Delivered by ClickSend

Text alerts are the fastest way to receive important public safety and emergency information from the Village.

You may receive texts about:

- ➔ Water or utility disruptions
- ➔ Road closures or access restrictions
- ➔ Weather-related emergencies
- ➔ Other urgent Village notices requiring timely attention

- ➔ You can unsubscribe at any time by replying STOP

AirdrieRCMP offers refresher on motorcycle safety

Airdrie, Alta. – Airdrie RCMP is reminding motorcyclists to pay extra attention to road conditions and safety equipment this month.

Roadways in Alberta have experienced significant freeze and thaw cycles this year, which can result in more potholes and uneven surfaces. Additionally, gravel is still present from wintertime road sanding.

Motorcyclists are encouraged to follow these safety tips before heading out:

- Wear the right gear: a proper fitting helmet, jacket, pants, boots and gloves.
- Always stay alert and obey posted speed limits.
- Pay attention to road conditions. Look out for gravel, potholes, and potentially slippery surfaces.
- Stay out of other motorist's blind spots and give yourself enough time to stop. Practice defensive driving. Having an awareness of what is behind you is just as important as knowing what is happening in front of you.
- Take time to refamiliarize yourself with your motorcycle's functions and handling, as this can lapse over the winter months.
- Watch out for changing road conditions throughout the day.

Motorists should keep an eye out for motorcycles, especially when changing lanes (checking to ensure blind spots are clear) and when turning left at an intersection or entering a busy roadway.
