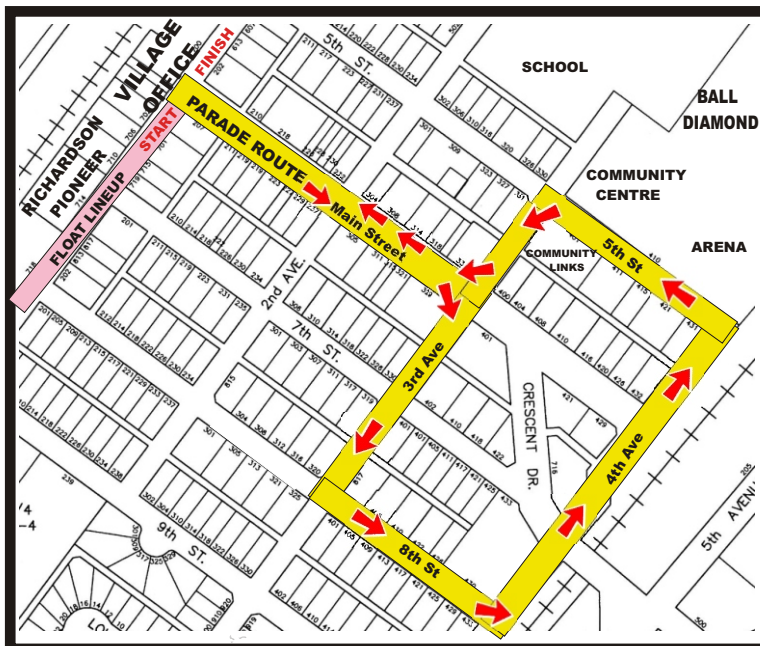

# An enhanced recycling program is coming in 2026!

Changes are coming to your recycling program on October 1, 2026.

Your recycling program will be managed by Circular Materials, a not-for-profit Producer Responsibility Organization (PRO) responsible for Alberta's transition to Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR).

With this transition comes more convenience – and more recycling options. Starting October 1, 2026, you'll be able to recycle more materials in your curbside recycling program and at your local depot.

More details will be provided in July! In the meantime, keep doing what you are doing. There are no changes to your recycling system until October 1, 2026.

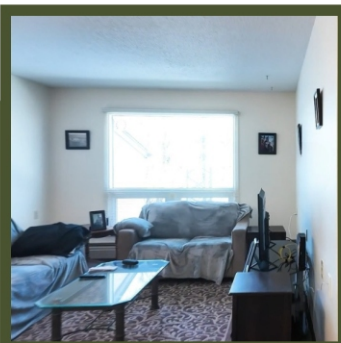

## Beiseker Transfer Station– Construction Bin Guidelines

Residents are reminded that the Construction Bin at the Beiseker Transfer Station is designated for construction and renovation materials only.

### Accepted Materials

The following materials are accepted in the Construction Bin:

- Asphalt shingles
- Painted or stained wood
- Treated wood
- Carpet underlays/underpads
- Linoleum and vinyl flooring
- Wood flooring, including solid wood, engineered wood, and composite wood
- Porcelain sinks and toilets



### Disposal Fee:

\$50 per half-ton truck load

### Materials Not Accepted

The following materials are NOT accepted in the Construction Bin:

- Asphalt
- Concrete

### Appliance Disposal

All appliances, including dishwashers, washing machines, dryers, and stoves, must be disposed of in the Metal Bin at no charge.

### Please Do Not Place the Following in the Construction Bin

- Furniture
- Electronics
- Animal waste

These items have designated disposal areas or bins at the Transfer Station.

### Important Reminder Regarding Refrigerants

Items containing refrigerants are NOT accepted at the Beiseker Transfer Station. Please do not place refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, or any other refrigerant-containing items in the Construction Bin or any other bin at the site.

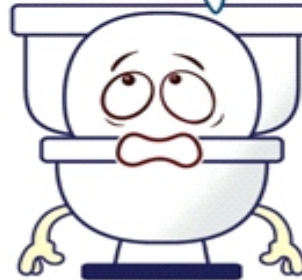

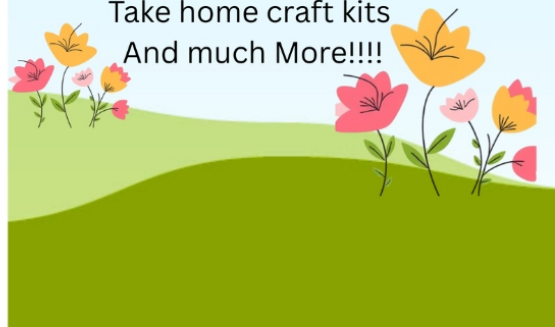

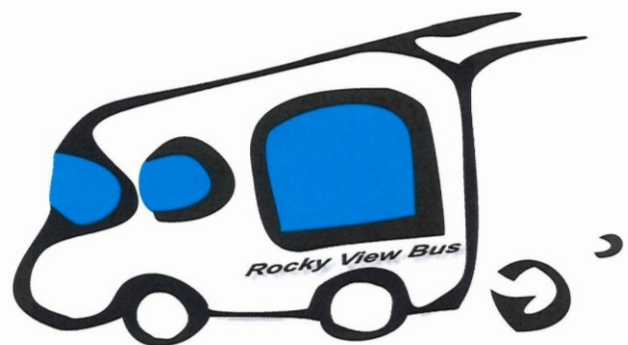

## SMS Text Alerts Delivered by ClickSend

Text alerts are the fastest way to receive important public safety and emergency information from the Village.

You may receive texts about:

- ➔ Water or utility disruptions
- ➔ Road closures or access restrictions
- ➔ Weather-related emergencies
- ➔ Other urgent Village notices requiring timely attention

- ➔ You must sign up (opt in) to receive alerts
- ➔ You can unsubscribe at any time by replying STOP
