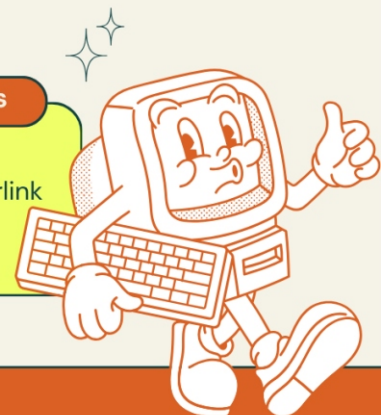

As a driver, always slow down when approaching a crosswalk. Young children can dart out without looking, so make sure to be aware and not be distracted when driving.

- ⇒ Other urgent Village notices requiring timely attention

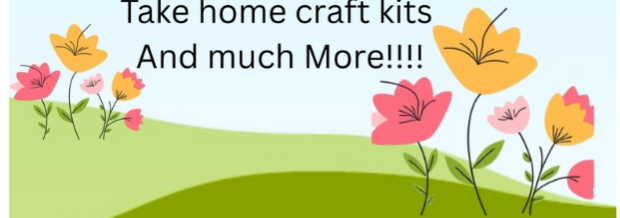

ALBERTA RCMP REMINDS DRIVERS TO TAKE EXTRA CARE WHEN BACKING UP

Backing into a person, vehicle, or object can happen in seconds. Before you put your vehicle in reverse:

- Look around and check your mirrors and blind spots for people, vehicles, and obstacles.
- Back up slowly. Keep your speed low and be prepared to stop.
- Check again. Keep watching as you move. If you lose sight of something, stop and check again.

When in doubt, stop and get out to check. A few extra seconds can prevent a serious collision.

ALBERTA RCMP REMINDS MOTORISTS THAT SCHOOL'S BACK IN SESSION AND SCHOOL BUS SAFETY IS A TOP PRIORITY

Back-to-school season is here, and that means more school buses on the road and more children walking to and from bus stops. Let's all do our part to keep kids safe.

- Slow down in school zones and residential areas, especially mornings and afternoons.
- Always stop for school buses with flashing red lights and extended stop arms—it's the law.
- Watch carefully for children crossing the street or waiting at bus stops.
- Avoid driving while distracted. Stay alert when you're behind the wheel.

ALBERTA RCMP REMIND DRIVERS TO KEEP BACK-TO-SCHOOL DROP-OFF AREAS SAFE

School drop-off and pickup areas can get busy quickly. Slow down, stay alert and give children plenty of space.

- Follow the signs. Obey no-parking and no-stopping restrictions, as well as directions from school staff and traffic control personnel.
- Watch for children. Children can be difficult to see between vehicles and may move unpredictably. Slow down and watch carefully for pedestrians and cyclists.
- Stop in the right places. Avoid stopping in travel lanes, crosswalks, intersections, bus zones or other prohibited areas.
- Keep crossings clear. Make sure pedestrians can see approaching vehicles—and drivers can see pedestrians.
- Let children exit safely. Whenever possible, have children exit on the sidewalk or curbside, away from traffic.
- Put the phone away. Distracted driving puts everyone in the school zone at greater risk.
- Don't rush. Congestion is expected during drop-off and pickup. Avoid aggressive driving or unsafe maneuvers to get around other vehicles.
- Children can be present even when a school zone doesn't appear busy, so slow down, expect the unexpected, and be prepared to stop.

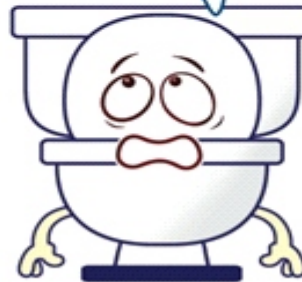

Alberta's Enhanced Recycling System



Starting October 1, 2026, your community's recycling program will be managed by Circular Materials

Starting October 1, 2026, your community's recycling program will be managed by Circular Materials. Circular Materials, a national not-for-profit, responsible for Alberta's transition to Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR).

Additionally, more materials will be accepted in the curbside and depot recycling programs across the province. The transition will introduce a more convenient, consistent, and effective recycling program across the province – a change that will not only benefit people, but also the province.

About Alberta's transition to EPR

- On October 3, 2022, the Alberta Extended Producer Responsibility Regulation was approved for single-use products, packaging, and paper products. Regulation and associated bylaws outline program requirements, targets and timeline.
- The transition to this new framework began on April 1, 2025. Phase 2 of the transition will begin on October 1, 2026, where more materials will be introduced into the recycling program. This new system operated by Circular Materials represents the evolution from product stewardship to a more circular economy where materials are collected, recycled and used again as recycled content in new packaging and products.

About Circular Materials

Circular Materials is the not-for-profit producer responsibility organization responsible for implementing and managing the new extended producer responsibility (EPR) system in Alberta.
